Group Costume Project: Want to be part of a group costume, but don't have the connections to other costumers to make it happen? We've got you covered! We'll announce a theme for the group costume after Worldcon in Glasgow. Just bring your own costume on the theme to Seattle, and be part of our group costume meetup.
